Professor Peck's talk will ask what difference it makes to analyze Chinese development 'conjuncturally'. He will reflect on the theme of Chinese (state) capitalism to highlight some of the main premises and procedural implications of conjunctural analysis.

Chair's Letter, continued

The CGSG will also sponsor the **2022** Asian Geographer Annual Lecture by Professor Neil Brenner during the AAG. His talk, entitled Extended urbanization—a concept in search of a theory?, will articulate the conceptualization of extended urbanization using eco-feminist and eco-materialist approaches in social reproduction theory. These emphasize the variegated "hidden abodes" of expropriation that support the wage nexus under capitalism. The lecture is scheduled to take place on Feb 26, 2022 at 9:40 am (EST) in Virtual Room 62.

In addition to the aforementioned two sessions, CGSG colleagues have organized more than 15 other paper sessions or panels, independently and jointly with other speciality groups. The CGSG continues to be one of the most active specialty groups at the AAG Annual Meetings. Since our members are based in different continents, the scheduled times may not be particularly convenient for all—though we hope that our great line-up of speakers will make waking up early or staying up late worthwhile! Since last April, we have worked to increase the CGSG's visibility and strengthen our connection with students. In November 2021, we co-sponsored the Career Mentoring Panel in Remote Sensing organized by the AAG's Remote Sensing Specialty Group. In addition, we were delighted by the enthusiastic response to the CGSG best student paper competition, advertised in August last year. A panel has been set up to review all papers submitted, and the final result will be announced at the CGSG business meeting during the AAG 2022 Annual Meeting. We have also been engaging with the student body by nominating a student representative to serve the CGSG Board. Currently, we are actively seeking nominations for the CGSG Outstanding Service Awards and the new Board Secretary. We expect the results to also be announced at the CGSG business meeting.

I reported in our last newsletter that some have suggested the idea of forming a nomination committee, for the purpose of proposing candidates to stand for election. The nomination committee, if formed, would assist the Board in nominating candidates and organizing the election for new board members. We continue to invite you to send us your ideas or suggestions via jiangxu@cuhk.edu.hk.

Call for papers from Asian Geographer

Asian Geographer (https://www.tandfonline.com/toc/rage20/current) is an international peer-reviewed journal disseminating knowledge about geographical problems and issues with a focus on Asia and the Pacific Rim. The journal would like to invite CGSG members to submit their works. Contributions may address any field of physical or human geographical inquiries and methodologies. Works based on other regions are also welcomed if they can demonstrate a linkage to Asia and the Pacific Rim. Priority is given to contributions which move beyond the profiling of specific geographical sites to promote a wider theoretical and conceptual understanding. Contributions are welcomed in the form of full-length original research articles, review papers and critical commentaries (max. 8,000 words), as well as shorter reports on latest fieldwork findings for the section "Asian Geography in Brief" (max. 4,000 words). The journal also welcomes proposals for special issues throughout the year. Proposals may be directed to Editor-in-Chief, Professor Jiang Xu, at jiangxu@cuhk.edu.hk.

Published twice a year by Routledge, Asian Geographer is indexed in the Emerging Sources Citation Index (ESCI) and Scopus. 2022 promises to be an exciting year for *Asian Geographer*, as the first Asian Geographer Annual Lecture will be held in the annual meeting of the American Association of Geographers. The lecture, entitled, "Extended Urbanization—A Concept in Search of a Theory?", will be delivered by Professor Neil Brenner, a renowned critical urban theorist from The University of Chicago. At the same conference, *Asian Geographer* is also sponsoring two paper sessions on "New Technologies and Urban Transformation", featuring 10 presentations which trace and interrogate the diverse and complex links between new technologies and urban transformation from a variety of critical perspectives.

February 2022 also sees the publication of Issue 1 of Volume 39 of *Asian Geographer*. The latest issue includes five articles covering Northeast, Southeast and South Asia, and examining both contemporary and historical socio-environmental changes.
